----- PROGRAM NOTES ------

Cherokee Morning Song is an authentic American song that comes from the Native American community.

East Virginia is a perennial folk song about unrequited love with roots in the Appalachian Mountain communities.

I'm Going Home comes from a tradition of sacred choral music that originated in the American South.

Deep River is an anonymous African American Spiritual born from the plantation and sorrow songs of the African American slaves in the Deep South.

Stormy Weather, a jazz standard, is a truly American art form that emerged from African American and European American musical parentage.

Jambalaya comes from the Creole tradition, which shares French, Spanish and African roots.

For Good from *Wicked* is from the American Musical Theatre genre told from the perspective of the witches of the Land of Oz.

Jailhouse Rock is from the Rock and Roll genre that pulls influence from R & B which in turn has its roots in the African American community.

Walk On is from the Gospel tradition, which traces its roots directly to the African American community.

Celtic Blessing uses the text of a traditional Gaelic blessing and sets it in the jazz style.

Some Days You Gotta Dance is an example of contemporary Country music, a genre of American popular music that originated in the Southern United States.

----- Our Accompanist ------

Rachel Hidlay began piano lessons when she was six years old. Since then, she has come to love making and sharing music with others. At the age of sixteen she was hired as a piano instructor at Bloomsburg University in the Piano Preparatory Department. Shortly after this she opened a private studio in her home. She holds a Bachelor's degree in piano performance with extra credits in music education from Liberty University, as well as a Master's degree in piano performance from Ithaca College where she studied with Dr. Jennifer Hayghe. She is currently completing an advanced certification in piano pedagogy.

Rachel teaches students of all ages and skill levels. She held teaching positions at Nazareth College, Ithaca College, Community Music School in Ithaca NY and the St. Peters Community Arts Academy in Geneva NY. She currently maintains a private studio of 40 students in her home. Besides teaching piano, Rachel is the music director at All Saints Catholic Church in Lansing, NY. There she directs the adult and children's choir (mostly from the piano!) and accompanies the cantors for mass. She also is on staff as an accompanist for Lansing school district.

Rachel loves all facets of music. She strongly believes music making/learning is a wonderfully unique journey. It is one that can enlighten and enrich a person's life. She greatly enjoys helping others navigate their own musical journeys.

Honey Child Soul Quintet was formed in 2012 for a production of a play called "No Child" by Nilajah Sun. The group performs and offers workshops at schools, churches, community events and music festivals. Members include Nikki Schwarz, Elisa Sciscioli, Shyla Foster, Harmony Graves and Travis Knapp.

Elisa Sciscioli came to Ithaca in 1998 to complete degrees in music education and vocal performance. She was the founder of the band Solstice and has sung with Mutron Warriors, Kevin Kinsella's band and the Destination. She has performed R&B, Reggae, African, Native-American, folk and classical music selections. Elisa has taught world music workshops and voice lessons since 2003. In 2009 she released an album of conscious soul music called Red Sky, which is available on iTunes!

Travis Knapp is a local songwriter, singer, and multi-instrumentalist (banjo, piano, kalimba, guitar). His uplifting acoustic folk-soul music can be found on his first two full-length albums "For Everything That's Good" [2014] and "Bright New Way" [2013], and his third album of original songs is due out in the spring of 2016.
